October 10, 2023 - General Meeting Minutes

Meeting was called to order by President Candy Roper at 7:03pm.

Marian Panter made a motion, second Nancy Hurwitz, to approve the September minutes as printed in the September newsletter. Motion passed unanimously.

Secretary Reports: None

Treasurer Report: Lexine Thompson was absent.

Committees:

Show Committee:

Candy stated, that the show income has been decreasing over the past three years. In 2023 we made \$16,857.00, in 2022 we made 4k more, and in 2021 we made 9k more. This year we received \$6,165.00 from parking (not sure how much was made last year, the parking price went up this year). The 6k from the Visitors Authority will help us this year.

Ann Kinney (via phone) asked if we had the same amount of people with RV parking as last year. Candy replied, that it has been about the same amount for the last 4 shows (50 average over three nights). Bruce was paid \$815.00. With our income declining, we might have to consider raising the entry price after a review and comparison of previous years. Entries were possibly down due to a big show in Colorado that fell on the same weekend as our show. We were down by 75-100 entries. The Colorado show is not usually on our weekend, we need to check to see if this will now be the norm. Numbers are going down in general but we have been fortunate until this year. Cindra Smith reiterated that we have 6k sitting there as a cushion for next year.

Candy spoke to the Visitors Authority Director and does not believe there will be any issue with them sponsoring Bonanza in the future.

Cindra asked, what the difference is between a show being sponsored vs supported. Candy stated that the difference is with a sponsored show, logos are not put on armbands, whereas supported shows they are. We put them on the premium list, catalogue, and judging schedules. We were given the option of putting them on the armbands but said no this year because we were not sure what was going to happen. It is 10 cents per armband and would have cost an additional \$80.00.

Thank You to all the committees and members for your help with the show! The show ran smooth except for the weather, but it could have been worse. The Stewards Association was short by one person so Ken Hansen, our new member, assisted on Saturday and Sue Haase assisted on Sunday. Douglas Oxborrow and Tonya Schwartz have been an immense help for the past few years. So many other people helped to make things run smoothly. Eagle Valley Golf Course donated the use of a gas run golf cart for Bob Kinney to use. It is difficult to thank everyone by name, but you know who you are!

Candy asked Thea Tsurumoto what her numbers were for the show. Thea stated that there were 61 runs for ACT (41 last year), 16 Trick Dogs, 17 CGC, and 4 CGCA. It was a good turn out. She was unable to get pictures of all the Trick Dogs. Thea stated having it in the premium list helped. A lot of people came from far or out of state. One lady came from Elko to participate.

Candy said the Visitors Authority was very impressed with the show. They have never attended a dog show before and were shocked with everything involved, from setting up, getting everyone where they needed to be, to the flow of judging of the many different breeds and the amount of people attending. While watching Pee Wees, David Peterson, the head of the Visitors Authority, introduced himself and they talked for about 30 minutes. He was blown away watching these little future handlers in the ring. He was most definitely impressed!

We had 15 Pee-Wees, which was unbelievable with it being our first time! Parents were thanking us, the kids were great! One little boy came out of the ring so excited about getting a dog bone! The group picture was adorable. There was one little girl missing. Ann (via phone) told a story about a disgruntled little boy & girl, the boy was upset about having to use his sister's dog, so Ann offered one of her dogs. Candy thanked Ann for letting the kids use one of her dogs. It made them very happy!

We need to send some donations as a "thank you". Last year - ROTC we gave \$500, Kiwanis Club -\$500, Truckee Meadows -\$300 and the lady who sang the National Anthem - \$100. Do we want to do the same this year? Marion Panter made a motion, second Cindra Smith, to make the donations as the same as last year. Motion passed unanimously.

We have hired a couple judges for the 2024 show. Lloyd & Lisa Glazer from Tennessee, who had Shelties, as per the request of the Sheltie Club. Hopefully it will increase their numbers. Christie Martinez from Washington, Sharon Walls from Reno for Salukis (Provisional), and Alvin Eng for Obedience/Rally. The membership was excited!! Thea suggested Linda Bianco for Obedience (possibly 2025) as well as Debbie Hanken (Provisional). Candy stated she will look them up to see if we can use them.

Cindra asked, what the dates are for next year? Candy said, September 28 & September 29. Candy read two "Thank You" notes from Cindy Lane and Kitty Speidel, two judges that attended our show this year that had great experiences.

Ann (via phone) commented that we had many compliments about the ROTC kids and how helpful they were to several of the exhibitors with helping pack quickly and efficiently! Job well done! Candy reiterated that, yes the ROTC kids were very assertive in asking people if they needed help. A couple of kids in the culinary program offered assistance in the kitchen, pulled up their sleeves and did the dishes! The Commander said that our show is the most popular community event that they do and unfortunately they had to turn kids away, with 75 kids applying! They were really awesome and did a great job at the gate as well.

Marian cited an issue brought up by an exhibitor who owns Standard Poodles, in regards to the south end and south end door of the building. The Chihuahua people and other small breed groups were basically "camped out" blocking much of that area all day. They had so many dogs with grooming equipment it made it impossible to enter. Although it is stated in the premium "if you are done you need to pack up and leave" they did not. Tensions were building and it was very difficult for other breeds to enter and prep their dogs to go into the ring for judging. The AKC Rep told them several times, but it did not make a difference. We will need to police that area better next year. We can get the kids to help do that.

Ann (via phone) stated we had one injury- they needed a band aide.

New Business:

Candy explained that the AKC has a new title - FETCH. Thea said, it's like Utility & Retriever, it needs two qualifying legs. It is not completely standardized yet. Once all the information is out the club will be notified.

Candy announced that in August she added a visitors counter to the club website. From August 5 through October 10, we had 2500 visitors to the website! It is \$20 a month to maintain but well worth it. Marion stated that Thea should be listed as a trainer on the website!

Candy informed the membership that she had an email from the 4H Director in Carson City and that she needs help with the dog training part. It appears that she wants to step down, but we are **not** going to take it over. Thea said it is a mess and the 4H information is out dated. Carolyn Goepner asked if it's for the county or state. Thea answered, for the state I guess. Marion stated parents need to step up, assist and encourage their children with their dogs rather than just dropping them off like they are going to a babysitter. Candy said they meet 3x a month - 2x for dog training and 1x for other activities. Thea said she has offered several times but never heard back from anyone.

Candy reported that we need to appoint the Nominating Committee.


