Northern Nevada Belgian Tervuren Club will be offering professional photos of your dog at the match as a fundraiser for their fall specialties. 100% of the profit goes to their club. A flyer is attached for your information.

We need to have a work bee either July 8 (after the match), or we will need to pick a date *soon* to go out & get the trailer organized. It needs to be put together before our shows. We need to find the new title rosettes so we know whether to order more for this year, & just get everything organized so we can find what we need this fall.

General Meeting Minutes ~ May 2, 2023

Meeting was called to order by President Candy Roper at 7:05 p.m.

Vikki Jaramillo made a motion, second by Marian Panter, to approve the April minutes as printed in the April newsletter. Motion passed unanimously.

Secretary reports: None

Treasurer report:

Lexine Thompson was absent but sent report through Candy Roper as follows: Beginning balance - \$33,220.22, income \$44.02 through PayPal for membership dues. Expenses \$290.53 which were for trophies, website, telephone, the new club banner, and business cards. Ending balance - \$32,974.31.

Candy discussed the 501c3 status. Help was found, but due to schedule conflicts with Lexine and Candy, a meeting with said person has not been scheduled. Candy will call so we can proceed with the process. The Bylaws will need to be changed. Candy will work on this as soon as the premium list is done.

Committees

Show Committee:

Candy stated that the judging assignments have been posted on AKC. They are not approved yet, but we don't foresee any issues. Candy met with the Carson City Visitors Authority about our show becoming a sponsored event and was informed that they might pay for both the park rental fees and janitorial service fees. A list of our expenses was requested and promptly sent. The list included everything we could come up with to show how much money Bonanza puts back into the community. Candy received an email today from the contact person, who stated that once the expense list is received, he will speak with his boss to see what they can do. It appears they will give us money but not sure how much. While talking with the Visitors Authority, they told Candy one of the City Supervisors told them they should work with Bonanza Kennel Club! Candy went to High School with that Supervisor who is also a Board member of the Visitors Authority. We will have to put their logo on our website, in the premium list, & catalog.

We have more trophy donations, Lynn McLellan will do Owner Handler Reserve Best in Show and Laurel Consalvo will do the Hound Group. We received a check from the Sheltie Club to sponsor the final Herding Group gift card. Sharon White and Marian Panter also donated to the trophy fund. The Trophy Committee has two breeds to cover to be finished. Vikki showed samples of cost-effective trophies, such as; travel/make up bags, various metal signs, and other trophies she bought with donations. Maureen Shannon is now on the Trophy Committee and helping out.

Candy stated that for Pee Wee, this year we should set a limit, which we probably will not meet, but so we can know how many and what we are going to give them. Are we giving medallions or ribbons? Have been watching other club premiums and they usually limit to 20-25. I doubt we will get that many, but you never know. Thea Tsurumoto said, medals are cool, they make noise! Maureen stated they can hang them in their bedroom. Thea answered that they can wear them proudly around their neck.

Candy has been getting information on hotels for the judges. They don't come cheap! The Marriott rooms, with non-refundable advanced purchase, are \$183 a night. (The weekend rate is \$214 that weekend.) That is the best they will do. Candy contacted Gold Dust West, where we put the judges last year. Their rooms are \$130. The Marriott is much nicer and has more restaurant options and stores you can walk to. That is one of the big draws, plus it is so near the fairgrounds.

An exhibitor with an RV had major issues with Gold Dust West last year. They were harassed by the staff, in the interim one of the managers said they did not need the dog club there! Candy contacted them about room rates and mentioned the issue, providing the employee names. They said one is no longer there, the other is still working there and will be spoken to. Hotels at the north end of Carson City do not have access to restaurants. There is The Max with the Black Bear Diner.

General Meeting Minutes ~ May 2, 2023

We need to decide what we are going to do for the Judges. They did not complain about Gold Dust, but the Marriott is so much better. A plus with Marriott is they do not allow dogs, so judges are not exposed to the exhibitors. Carson Valley Inn is too far. The Plaza used to be nice and they can walk to Red's or the new Nashville. Bob Kinney suggested using the Marriott. It's \$50 a night more than Gold Dust. We have eight Judges so it would be \$800 more. We will have income from Carson City Visitors Authority, but we could do a lot with that money in other places. Maybe the Visitors Authority can get rooms cheaper?

Candy said Pacific Malinois Club wants to do a scent event with us again. We wanted to do an AKC event, but Bonanza is not licensed for scent. The Malinois Club is going to be looking into other options for this year. They want to get to where we can do a three day trial event. They are not a recognized club, so we have to be the licensed club. We have agreed to do another Friday event with them this year, so they are working on something and will come back to us with a proposition.

To get licensed for scent, we need five members with at least two years of scent work. We discussed possibly having other clubs that have scent work to come and join us and possible pros and cons. Candy stated we don't want to cut the Malinois club out.

Match Committee:

Cindra Smith, Match Chair, is absent because she is not feeling well. The application was submitted and we are waiting for AKC approval. The rosette for Best Junior needs to be ordered. AKC said there is no color restriction for Best Junior at a match. Do we want to do Best Junior and Reserve Junior? Yes, encourage youth participation. Make the reserve rosette smaller, both the same color.

For Juniors at the B-Match, as far as AKC is concerned, any dog they bring is good. They can be All-American, spayed or neutered, limited registration, or no registration.

New Members:

Ken Hansen is not present tonight. Eve Auch is in Utah at dog shows. Lisa Hamilton is here. It is her second meeting, welcome! Lisa has English Cocker Spaniels. She is going to be doing Rally with them as well as conformation.

Unfinished Business:

Candy inquired about the Carson Tahoe Home Show. Ann Kinney has both our banners and all the brochures from the last show. Candy told her we want only the Bonanza Kennel Club banner displayed, not the dog fanciers banner. Candy has a box from AKC with, "responsible dog owner" blue plastic bracelets. Marian requested membership applications, so if by chance someone wants to join the club, they don't have to go online. The booth size is 10 X 10, it will not accommodate too many people at a time.

AKC is now offering in AKC college a free course on Ring Stewarding. For an experienced steward it may not be helpful but for beginners it's good.

Vikki informed us, that she is trying to work with a friend from high school who works with channel 4, KRNV news, about getting us airtime for our show and match! Club members can be with their dogs and do small demonstrations of what we do to show the public and get exposure for the club. We can put together a little bio on the events we participate in. It would be great for them to maybe come onsite during the show! Candy stated that Truckee Meadows did a segment called "People to Know" on channel 2 with Wendy as the spokesperson. It was really nice! Vikki said she will try as best she can to get this done.



Pilot Program for Three-Legged (Tripod) Dogs in Non-Jumping Rally and Obedience Classes

An 18-month pilot program, allowing tripod dogs to participate in the non-jumping obedience and rally classes, was approved by the AKC Board of Directors, **beginning July 1, 2023, and ending December 31, 2024**. The sport specific regulation language in Chapter 1, Section 17 will be amended to read: Dogs disfigured as the result of accident, injury, or illness are eligible to compete provided the disfigurement does not interfere with functional movement. A dog that shows no signs of physical discomfort is to be considered fit to compete. The judge must excuse a dog as "unfit to compete" if the dog demonstrates sickness, discomfort, or pain while performing. All Obedience and Rally judges will receive notifications and regulation inserts will be published.
